## Graduating Grade 12 in Saskatchewan in 2025 \& 2026

Students must pass certain required courses such as English language arts, math and science in order to graduate with a Grade 12 program standing. Students must earn 24 course credits, at least 5 of which need to be at the Grade 12 (30/31) level.

The Ministry of Education determines the course numbering system. The first digit indicates the year level: 10 is a grade ten course, $\underline{\mathbf{2}} \mathbf{0}$ is a grade eleven course, and $\underline{\mathbf{3}} \mathbf{0}$ is a grade twelve course. The second digit indicates the type of course: " 0 " indicates a regular academic course " 1 " indicates a modified (general) course. Example: Math 11 is the Grade 10 Modified Math course. Modified courses shall only be approved in consultation with the student support teacher and administration as specific criteria must be met for this type of programming.

The high school courses offered at CCS allow students to graduate with a fully recognized Saskatchewan Grade 12 Diploma and meet all the admission requirements for whatever a student may choose to pursue upon graduation! Our graduates have been awarded prestigious national and international scholarships. They have been admitted into highly competitive university programs and have succeeded in those programs and beyond.

Students with special interests in courses not offered face-to-face at CCS may take credits online through the Saskatchewan Distance Learning Centre. It is important to note that these courses are not free (school divisions and associate schools are billed $\$ 500.00$ per student per course). Therefore:
$\checkmark$ Students wanting to take a course that is not required to graduate, is not a requirement for post-secondary admissions, or is for personal interest only, will be required to pay for the full cost of the course. A $\$ 250$ deposit must be paid to CCS before a student can be registered for any course. The remaining balance is due at the end of the course. If the student does not achieve a passing mark, thus failing to complete the course, the $\$ 250$ deposit will be retained by CCS. Additionally, the parents will be responsible for paying any outstanding administrative course fees owed to CCS.
$\checkmark$ If a course(s) is required for graduation, on track graduation, or post-secondary admission requirements, CCS agrees to pay for the online course(s) required if the course(s) is not available to the student to take on-site at CCS and are outside the prescribed CCS timetables. A $\$ 250$ Administration fee deposit must be paid before the student will be registered in any course. The deposit will be refunded upon confirmation of completion and a passing final grade.
