PICK UP/DROP OFF TRAFFIC INSTRUCTIONS

Please make note of the attached Pick Up/Drop off Movement Diagram. If you are in the Pick Up zone and your child is not exiting the school for pick up within the 5 minutes of idle time, you will need to move back into the flow of traffic to allow others the opportunity to pull in OR Park in a parking spot in the parking lot. FUNDSCRIP TUITION FUNDRAISING PROGRAM

Saving money for tuition can be tough. That is why we have partnered up with a national gift card fundraising group called Fundscrip to help our families build a savings account for their children's future CCS tuition. FundScrip is an established, Canada-wide fundraising program which gives people the opportunity to purchase gift cards(groceries, gas, home & garden, entertainment, restaurants, and much more) through their organization (CCS)with a percentage of that gift card balance bumped back to the purchaser's account. The office keeps track of the percentages earned and will let families know how much goes towards next year's tuition at the end of the year. Orders are put in twice a month and can be made through the CCS office directly. This year's first order will be tomorrow-Wednesday, Sept 3rd.

<u>A and B Teams-</u> Are for those students in grades 6 -8. Depending on numbers of participants, grade 5 students will occasionally be invited to play on our B teams.

<u>Junior Teams-</u> Are for those students in grades 9 and 10, that compete in the MJHSAA (Moose Jaw High Schools Athletic Association) Junior League.

<u>Junior Varsity Teams</u>—Are typically for smaller schools that can not fill both a junior team and a senior team so they will have a team made up of students from grades 9–12. Our JV teams compete in the MJHSAA Junior Varsity League.

<u>Senior Teams-</u> Are for those students in grade 11 and 12. Our senior teams compete in the MJHSAA Senior League.
